### ➤ State Budget News


- What we know so far:
  - Governor's budget proposes.....
  - Budget trailer bill proposes clean-up language to MHSA
  - SB1136 also proposes "fine tuning of the Act" –
     see handout for details
  - Not a done deal more to be revealed in the near future

- ➤ AB100 passed March 24, 2011, in response to California's budget crisis
- ➤ Redirected MHSA funds one time in FY11-12 to fund other mental health programs
- Changed how MHSA funds flow to counties from month to month
  - As a result:
    - Cash flow could become an issue in the future


- ➤ Eliminated power of State DMH and the MHSOAC to review/approve county plans and expenditures
  - □ As a result:
    - Approval of plans is moved to local level
    - DMH will become a division of Department of Health Care Services on July 1, 2012, and some parts of it are going to other departments
    - Unclear which DMH guidelines will stand if any


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- > Remains the same:
  - MHSA funds may only be used for approved plans
  - Stakeholder input and local planning processes are necessary
  - Supplantation of existing state or county funds with MHSA funds not allowed



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



  - Program Highlights
- □ FY12-13 proposed
  - Programs continue to serve the same target populations, service targets, budgets
  - New or expanded CSS Projects

- Workforce Education & Training
  - >FY10-11 progress
    - 8 agency partners implementing programs
    - Diversity in career pathway programs
  - >FY12-13 proposed
    - All programs to continue
    - New or expanded WET programs

- Prevention & Early Intervention
  - □ FY10-11 progress
    - 13 agency partners implementing projects
    - RBA from the ground up
  - □ FY12-13 proposed
    - Projects are continuing as approved
    - New or expanded PEI programs

- Technological Needs
  - □ FY10-11 progress
    - Electronic Health Record (E.H.R.)
    - Consumer/Family Access to Computing Resources
  - □ FY12-13 proposed
    - Data Warehousing and Document Imaging approved in FY11-12 will move forward
    - New or expanded TN Projects

- > Innovation
  - □ FY10-11 progress
    - AOD budget process and lessons learned
    - Nine new community-based projects selected to forward the BHRS Learning Edges
  - □ FY12-13 proposed
    - Community-based projects continue
      - 5 complete in FY13-14
      - 4 complete in FY14-15
    - Future Innovation Projects
